What's in a Name?

Can a name symbolize a lifetime of events? In my case, it has. "Remarkable" is my boat of over a quarter of a century. It was named "Remarkable" because of a lifetime of "remarkable" name changes.



In fourth grade, I hated my first name and refused to be called by that name. I convinced my teachers that my good grades would only continue, IF I was called by my new first name, Gary. They reluctantly conceded because of my perseverance. You might say it was "remarkable."

As an adult, I continued to influence people as a teacher and then as an advertising salesperson, and eventually as part owner of a Shopping Guide. All of these events are connected in a remarkable and real way. My name changing throughout my life is connected to my real perseverance which is connected to my success in business and boating.

Now I have a chance to leave a legacy of "remarkable" perseverance with my (2) sons and (7) grandchildren by bringing them to boat shows every year to continue the legacy of classic boating. My fully restored 1961 Larson, with original Gale engine, has won 3 awards. My family and the Remarkable will be at the WCCB show in 2013 looking forward to the real possibility of winning our 4th award and keeping the classic boating family tradition alive and well.

I'm also looking forward to having one or more of my grandchildren at the Hagerty Youth Judging Event in 2013.

We're not getting any younger! How will you leave your legacy?

WOODEN CARS AND BOATS IN UPSTATE NEW YORK

“Rain, rain go away...” and go away it did! After a rainy Friday (aren't vacuum wipers a hoot?), Saturday dawned sunny and bright with temperatures in the low 80s. An almost perfect day for the second annual gathering of woodie cars and wooden boats at the Keuka Lake park in Hammondsport, NY.

Parked at the former Bath & Hammondsport Railroad depot were the woodies and next to the depot were dozens of wood boats of all sizes and vintages. Woodie owners present included Doug Baer's 1948 Chevrolet, Jeff and Cathy Yeagel's 1940 Ford, Ted and Linda Holz's 1939 Chevrolet, Richard Vice's rare 1931 Model A Special Delivery, Larry Nagode's 1947 Chevrolet and Jerry Ludwig and Sarah Rockwell's 1948 and 1950 Fords.

Of special interest was the mostly original 1947 Chevrolet formerly owned by Case Western Reserve University and now owned by Nagode of East Aurora, NY. This car was featured in Woodie Times in the 1980s since it had made a 10,000 mile trip around Africa for a university professor and his entourage in the 1940s. Larry Nagode posted extensive documentation of the car including the original invoice.

The interest of the many spectators (there is no admission charge) was heart warming. There was a steady stream of admirers around the cars the entire day, which likely will result in a few more club members! Since Hammondsport is a lake town, many of the older visitors remembered having woodies at their summer cottages.

Wine Country Classic Boats, the sponsors of the show, were warm and welcoming. They kicked off the weekend with a complementary wine and cheese gathering at the Keuka Yacht Club and were more than anxious to ensure that woodie owners were treated royally. The small town of Hammondsport is delightful and this, coupled with the gracious hospitality we received, made for a memorable weekend.

So, plan to save the third weekend in July, 2013 for next year's show. I suspect that we'll have even more woodies present then.

How can you not be entranced by Keuka Lake and the village of Hammondsport?

Let's start with the lake. Keuka is the only Finger Lake with a "Y" shape. All the other Finger Lakes are long and narrow. As a result, the 20 mile long lake has a 60 mile long shoreline! The shoreline is mostly developed with residences, both seasonal and year-round, as well as some great restaurants. Branchport and Penn Yan are at the northern end of the lake, offering lodging, restaurants, and full service marinas. One of the nicest state campgrounds you will find in New York is near Branchport. It is a full service park with campgrounds, a beach, boat launch, docks for rent, a lake-side building that can be rented, and one of the coolest playgrounds you've ever seen! The Keuka Lake Wine Trail boasts 8 wineries! The deep lake (up to 186') supports a healthy trout and salmon fishery, as well as bass and perch and a large population of baitfish (mostly alewives).



The village of Hammondsport was founded around 1827 by Lazarus Hammond, and incorporated in 1856. The village later became a center for New York's wine industry. Other than wine, the village's primary claim to fame was as the birthplace and industrial center of Glenn Curtis (1878-1930). Curtis was a renowned expert on gasoline engines, and designer and manufacturer of motorcycles and early aircraft and seaplanes. There is a sizable and excellent museum just south of Hammondsport that celebrates Curtis' genius with all things mechanical. The Hammondsport Chamber of Commerce trumpets itself as "The Cradle of Aviation and Heart of the New York State Wine Region" and calls Keuka Lake "Jewel of the Finger Lakes." The village is relatively small (around 700 people in less than 1/2 square mile), but was voted "America's Coolest Small Town" last year by Budget Travel Magazine (actually it was a tie with Beaufort, NC). It has many lodging options and a number of restaurant choices from simple and inexpensive to fancy and costly. For my money, you could not ask for a more unique, fun, and wonderful place for a Northeast classic boat show the 3rd weekend every July. Mark your calendars now for July 19, 20 and 21, 2013, and let's show folks how cool our classic fiberglass boats are!
